

A reflection from the Pastor

Peace. It was a rather simple question the man ran up to ask Jesus – straight to the point: "Good teacher, what must I do to inherit eternal life? It really was one of those 'give me the bottom line' type questions. Although Jesus' answer was not simple like he expected, he had done everything on the list, or so he thought, until Jesus said, go sell everything and give to the poor and come follow me. We are told the man went away sad because he had many possessions. Peter even tells Jesus, we have given up everything, and yet Jesus acknowledges that maybe in just saying that, we are still holding on to what we had.

The answer to eternal life is just as Jesus said, to abandon everything, give, and follow him. We can do that with the things of this world, but we must not let them be us, we must not let them dictate how we follow Jesus. For example: if we say, I am going to give this alm to the poor, but only because the Lord is going to give me more money – that is not abandoning everything and giving –that is only looking after self. Jesus says in the gospels – don't just give out of your surplus (when you seem to have too much) but give because it is the way of following Him – a means to eternal life.
