

A reflection from the Pastor

Peace. Merry Christmas.

Today's liturgy celebrates the Holy Family of Jesus, Mary and Joseph. The gospel speaks about their trip to the temple for the feast of Passover when Jesus was twelve. When leaving for home, Mary and Joseph thought Jesus was with them, but he had stayed behind. He was listening and asking questions of the teachers. When they found him, Jesus asked them, "did you not know that I must be in my Father's house?" Often translated, 'about my Father's business,' Jesus' response was not one of disrespect, but of witness to why he came. As the gospel tells us, even though he knew who he was, he went back with Mary and Joseph and listened to them, growing in wisdom, age, and favor.

If we are to model our families after the holy family, then as children we too must be about our Father's business, coming to his house and listening and asking. And if we are called to be parents then we must allow our children to grow in wisdom, age, and favor by showing them the beauty of God.

Let us pray in this week for strength and peace among all families.

As you will notice on the liturgy/mass schedule, there will be no liturgies the days of January 8-11. I will be attending the priest retreat at the Spiritual Renewal Center. Priests are required by canon law to make a yearly retreat. Please keep me and the other priests from the diocese in your prayers.
