

A reflection from the Pastor

Peace. This Sunday we hear the first part of what is known as Jesus' "Bread of Life Discourse" from St. John's Gospel. In reality it is a prelude to what Jesus will institute in the Eucharist, in which he offered His own Body and Blood for the salvation of the world.

The situation presented is probably one very familiar to you – lots of people and you must feed them. A common example is family. As it grows – older or in numbers, they must be fed – and one has to ask: "Where am I going to get enough food?" Many families ask that question every day in our world.

In the gospel, this was our Lord and God asking the same thing. And yet he relied on those near him – his disciples and the boy with five loaves and two fish. He first gave thanks to God for what he had and then he gave it to feed five thousand, plus some left over. That is a testament to the power of our God.

I invite you this week to bring before God, that which seems unable to be enough – whether it's basic human needs, or gas for your commute to work, or a state of mind, or maybe a relationship that has gone sour. Present what you have to the Lord, give Him thanks for that gift, and let him multiply the rest. You will find that there will be even some left over and your day will be brighter in Him.

On an administrative note, I met with the Parish Finance Council, Religious Education instructors, and Lectors and Ministers of Holy Communion. They were all productive meetings. I am highly optimistic about the well being of the parish. As I being to administer in the parish, you may see things done a little differently. First, I ask that you offer suggestions. Second, as I pray for your well being, pray also that we will remember our common mission – to know and serve the Lord. Third, change is good – patience is the virtue. Let us remember that dictum.

Thank you to all who helped with my installation. I am now officially your pastor.

Religious Education Program/Registration

The time is soon approaching to register the children for religious education classes. This education is so important to them and to the church – for they need to be formed well in the ways of the faith to face the world.

I want to consider having separate dates for the children to come. This proposal needs discussion and that is where the parents come in. If you have questions call me at the parish office. This will alleviate overcrowding and truly allow the children to learn. I propose the following schedule:

Groups will meet every other Wednesday evening @ 7:00 p.m.
1-7 grades and 8-12 grades

Once each quarter, I would like the children/families to come together and build their faith by having an activity together. We'll see how it goes and maybe have more.

The dates for registration are:

August 23 and August 30 at 7:00 p.m. in the
Heritage Room. And Tues – Friday at parish office.

Registration will be closed September 4, 2006.

The fee for classes is \$15 per child. Again, don't let the fee be a hindrance to your child's faith. Start saving now. If you need assistance with the fee, please let me know. Your child's education in the faith is my primary concern. The fee pays for books and supplies.

Students registering for sacraments of Confirmation and Eucharist need to bring copies of their baptismal certificate (unless they were baptized at St. Patrick).

Continue to pray for the teachers and students as we begin this year of learning more about the faith.

Adult Faith Education

We should all continue to grow in faith education. I will be offering adult sessions (for example on the bible) each half of the year (Fall and Spring). Get ready, this September – October will be a course on the Gospel according to St. Luke. More later.
