

A reflection from the Pastor

In this octave of Christmas, we celebrate the feast of the Holy Family of Jesus, Mary, and Joseph (JMJ). The readings invite us to think about this special relationship which we have with other human beings: our families. At times we may wonder, could this or that person really be related to me, especially if they do something inconsistent with our morals or ethics. But the nature of today's feast asks us to look at our own place within the family and to make sure that we are living up to our responsibilities. Indeed, if each member did their part, the family would be a dynamic reality, that while having some faults, would reflect the love of the Holy Family of Jesus, Mary and Joseph.

I think this can be a reality in two ways. First, families must pray and read the scriptures together. If the family is only for learning how to make it in the world, and not make it in the world to come, then the family is not whole. Second, families must seek forgiveness daily. They must ask one another to forgive them and try to rise above the pettiness of a world tuned in to sin. In this holy season, try to make an effort to sanctify your family. Start small, and be consistent, remembering that we all belong to the family of God.
