

A reflection from the Pastor

"The people were astonished at Jesus' teaching," today's gospel according to St. Mark. People have a difficult time with bad news, so much so, you would think 'good' news would be easier to handle. The good news of Jesus – translated 'gospel' is sometimes difficult to understand. We are not told by St. Mark just what Jesus had been teaching, but we are told that the people were astonished by his understanding and wisdom. The further fact that Jesus expelled an unclean spirit from a man, shows that his teaching and authority comes not from some sort of magic, but from His Father above.

And so the question becomes, from where do we derive our 'good news'? Or is everything we have to share bad news? If you look at the television news or newspaper reports, they almost always start with bad news. Maybe it's because we have come to expect it at the beginning or on the front page. Either way, the news that we are called to share on a daily basis is that Jesus loves us so much that he was willing to lay down his life for our salvation – so we could be with our Father in heaven. When we come to witness to that, even in the darkest moments of our lives – then we too, like Jesus, help to astonish the world and drive out those 'unclean' spirits, making room for his Holy Spirit.

28 Pre-Baptism Instruction 10 Heritage
To baptize, you must be a registered parishioner for at least four months and attending Mass. If from another parish (immediate family [i.e., parents or grandparents] are active parishioners) you must provide a letter from your pastor stating you are active and you must attend your parish's baptismal class. Baptisms are held the first Sunday of each month except during the seasons of Advent and Lent.
