

A reflection from the Pastor

"Jesus summoned the Twelve and began to send them out two by two," in today's gospel according to Mark. In many ways, this time of the Church year known as 'ordinary' invites us to think about our relationship with the Jesus who organized a very particular religion; so much so that he sent out those he had called to continue his work. And it wasn't easy in those days. They had no car to jump into, there was no media to read about the next city, there were no telephones. You get the picture. And to make the issue even more severe, Jesus says to take nothing with them, only to go out in pairs. Sandals, tunic, and a walking stick. No food, no sack, no money in their belts. Now, that's hard for us to imagine.

But think for a minute. Jesus did this so that they would not mistake the message for the messenger. They were to live what they preached. The same is really true for us, even in our twenty-first century world. He invites, rather calls us, to go out and proclaim the gospel, not in part but in whole which is why so many get frustrated. The person who gives to a charity in order to run the charity in the end, is not following the most basic of Jesus' commands. Our heart is what Jesus wants, to be his servants, so much so that we forget about our own human needs, so as to serve his need of bringing all to recognize the incredible gift of salvation. Jesus by his short life on earth, death, and resurrection, showed us that while earth is about perfecting our soul, that work cannot be apart from the desire to be in heaven with our Father forever. They are one in the same goal.

What will you let go of this week to help you deliver the message without hesitation? It could be an attitude or a way of thinking, or maybe it's a tangible physical thing.

Saint of the Week

Saint Bonaventure

Bishop, Doctor of the Church



Born in 1221 at Bagnoregio, Italy. Healed from a childhood disease through the prayers of Saint Francis of Assisi. Bonaventure joined the Order of Friars Minor at age 22. Studied theology and philosophy in Paris. Friend of Saint Thomas

Aquinas. Doctor of Theology. Friend of King Saint Louis. General of the Franciscan Order at 35. Bishop of Albano, Italy. Cardinal. Spoke at the *Council of Lyons*, but died before its close. Writer. Biographer of Saint Francis. Doctor of the Church.

Died July 15, 1274 at Lyon, France of natural causes. His name means: good fortune. He was canonized a saint April 14, 1482 by Pope Sixtus IV.

He is patron saint against intestinal problems.

To baptize, you must live within the parish boundary and should be attending Mass. If from another parish (immediate family [i.e., parents or grandparents] are active parishioners) you must provide a letter from your pastor stating you are active and you must attend your parish's baptismal class. Baptisms are held the first Sunday of each month except during the seasons of Advent and Lent.

Birth certificate of child is required before baptism.
