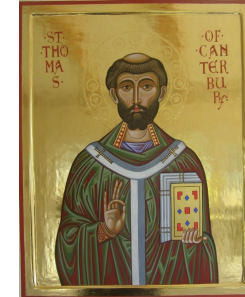

**St. Thomas Becket,  
bishop and martyr**

Today's saint was born in London in 1118. Until named Archbishop of Canterbury in 1162, Thomas Becket gave no indication of being a courageous and saintly man of the Church. Through an ecclesiastic, he had been Chancellor of the nation and friend of King Henry II. As Archbishop, however he defended the Church against the king. During a six year exile at a Cistercian Monastery in France, Thomas developed a monastic spirituality. Returning to England, he was assassinated by the King's men on December 29, 1170.



**December 31**

**St. Sylvester I, Pope**

Sylvester became Pope in 314, shortly after the Peace of Constantine. He served the Church as Pope for 21 years - one of the longest pontificates during the first Christian millennium. He fought Arianism and saw the Church develop in remarkable fashion. He started the basilicas of St Peter, St Paul and St John Lateran. Pope Sylvester is remembered also because his death occurred on the last day of the year in 335. He helps end the pilgrimage of each civil year.
