

A reflection from the Pastor

"They all ate and were satisfied," today's gospel according to St. Luke. If you have ever prepared a meal, with a predetermined amount of food, and then found out more people were coming to the meal, you would be nervous, if not anxious about whether you could feed everyone. You would probably be also wondering if they were satisfied, or in other words – full and pleased with the food. In today's gospel, Jesus' feeding of the five thousand, with five loaves and two fish was extraordinary and a sign of his willingness to please many from the little he had. The fact that they were all satisfied further showed that Jesus was more than just about meeting bodily needs, he was about making sure they were focused on him. From that group, there were probably many who came to follow Jesus. And maybe even more than that would witness from the apostles, what Jesus would later do at the last supper – when he gave his own body and blood for the life of the world – willing to please many from one. In the Eucharist, we are satisfied. We are not only fed physically, but we are fed for eternal life. Jesus tells us that if we eat his body and drink his blood, we will live for ever. And he will raise us on the last day. May our devotion and love of the Holy Eucharist – Jesus -- grow each day.
