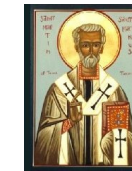

Saints of the Week



**November 10 –
St. Leo the Great,
pope and doctor**

Elected Pope in 400 and deceased in 461, Leo I shepherded the church in most difficult times. He had to fight barbarians from without and heretics from within. Leo had to confront and turn back Attila the Hun (452), witness helplessly the sack of Rome by the Vandals (455), and at all times care for the souls and bodies of his people. Fittingly he has been called Pope Leo the Great.



**November 11 – St.
Martin of Tours,
bishop**

Today's saint has become a legend. A Hungarian raised in Italy, an unwilling soldier converted to Christ, Martin gave away his cloak and became a monk in Gaul. Later he founded the first monastery in the West. In 372 this rugged unprepossessing person became bishop of Tours. His great work was to convert the pagan country side. Then only the cities held Christian. He organized a mission approach, founded more monasteries in a sense made France Catholic. Martin died in 397.



**November 13 – St.
Francis Xavier
Cabrini, virgin**

American Catholics have particular devotion to the first canonized United States citizen, to their "Mother Cabrini". Born in north Italy (1850), she was considered too sickly to join the local religious order. In time she energetically founded the Missionary Sisters of the Sacred Heart, started several houses in Italy and in 1889 came to New York to help Italian immigrants. Before her death from malaria in Chicago 1917, Mother Cabrini became a naturalized citizen, crossed the Atlantic 30 times, established 67 religious houses with more than 1500 daughters. She was canonized a saint in 1946.
