Father Samuel.

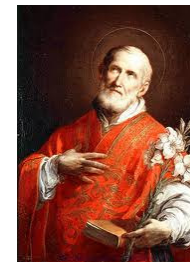
All are invited to celebrate Holy Mass in honor of

May 25th
St. Gregory VII
Pope

This is one of the most important
Popes of history. He lived at a time when ambitious
emperors wanted to take over the Church, and when
the Church itself was divided and weak. As the
Benedictine monk Hildebrand, he was active in
reforming the Church. As Pope (1073-1085) he
excommunicated Henry IV of Canossa fame. Gregory
VII worked to make the Papacy independent and to
keep the Church “free, chaste and Catholic.”



May 26th
St. Philip Neri,
Priest

Today we honor the “saint of joy” –
the delightful Philip Neri gifted with a special sense of
humor. Born in Florence in 1515, Philip came to
Rome at age 26 and never left the Eternal City. Rome,
recently occupied and sacked (1527) was in pitiable
condition. Philip visited the sick and imprisoned,
taught the children, heard confessions. He founded the
Oratorio of Divine Love – the Oratorian priests. Philip
delighted in walking to the Seven Basilicas in Rome.
He died at 80, was canonized in 1622, and remains an
influential force in Rome and throughout the Catholic
World.
