St. Francis Xavier,
Priest

This saint's story is one of heroic adventure. Born at Xavier (Navarre), Spain, in 1506, Francis was one of the first Jesuits. Though suffering from sciatica, he was ordered to preach the Gospel in the unknown Far East. For eleven years, in suffering and prayer, he brought the Gospel to India, Ceylon, and Japan. He died at the gates of China in 1552, at age 46, and was canonized a saint in 1662.



December 6th,
St. Nicholas,
Bishop

Few saints have received popular veneration comparable to St. Nicholas. He was bishop of Mira, on the southern coast of Turkey, in the first half of the 4th Century. An ancient tradition places him at the Council of Nicea in 325. Since 1087 his relics have been at Bari in Italy. Legends of his wonderful generosity made him a most popular saint, the "Santa Claus" of more recent centuries.
