October 24th,
St. Anthony Claret,
Bishop

Today's saint had a difficult, travel-filled life. Born in Spain (1807), he worked as a weaver before ordination in 1835. He preached in Spain and the Canary Isles and founded the Missionary Institute of Sons of the Immaculate Heart of Mary (the Claretians). He became Archbishop of Santiago in Cuba (1850-1857) and Confessor to the Queen of Spain (1857-1867). Archbishop Anthony Claret was deeply interested in the Catholic press and the First Vatican Council. Driven into exile France, he died peacefully-after many trials and revolutions-in 1870. He was canonized a saint in 1950.



October 28th,
Sts. Simon and Jude,
Apostle

Today we celebrate the feast of two Apostles. The name Simon is eleventh on the list of the Twelve. It is known that Simon came from Cana and was called "Zealot"-perhaps a member of the activist political party against Roman occupation of Judea. The apostle Jude, called Thaddaeus, spoke with Jesus during the Last Supper (Jn 14:22). In lists of the Apostles these two are always together.
